Our basic problem is the unfamiliarity of our analysts with VC/NVA communications entities. Sgts Miller and Hand are providing guidance. USM 626 has agreed informally to send an experienced analyst to the 6994 Local Operations for an initial assist. Formal request for this assistance was forwarded to USM 626 on 7 May. As we develop an ident expertise, we expect to provide the airborne platform with much better - technical support than it now receives. The eventual goal is timely target identification while airborne.

B. The next step will be to assign "alternate tasking" to the primary collection missions. The primary tasking for each position will be that assigned by the CMA which currently consists of little more than instructions to search for low level readable comms below 6 MHz. Our alternate tasking should be more specific, still concentrating on low level tactical comms but including whatever tech data we can provide, specific case assignments, C/SS predictions, etc.

C. In addition to providing alternate tasking for the collection position, we plan to provide the navigator with a more specific collection mission profile, refining the frag point to coincide with collection tasks.

2. The above procedures apply primarily to the collection missions. However, the increased analysis effort will also provide more effective tech support to ARDF missions, particularly with regard to supplemental

3. As more selective tasking is applied to the collection positions, an initial decrease in productivity is possible. The alternate tasking will be directed toward those low echelon tactical points which pass exploitable traffic and which are vulnerable, almost exclusively, to airborne intercept. The initial phases of selective search may result in lower productivity, but should eventually isolate that unique COMINT with which we should be concerned.

4. Will keep you advised as unforeseen problems arise and new parameters are defined.

5. For Det 1: SSgt Hand will return to your station on 11 May to further explain above concepts and to discuss unique aspects of your situation.
