Getting the job or career you want often starts with education, but covering tuition costs can be difficult. The My Career Advancement Account Scholarship is a workforce development program that provides up to \$4,000 of tuition assistance to eligible military spouses. The scholarship assists military spouses in pursuing licenses, certificates, certifications or associate degrees necessary to gain employment in high-demand, high-growth portable career fields and occupations. Confirm MyCAA eligibility

- Your spouse is on active duty in pay grades E1-E5, W1-W2 or O1-O2.
- You need to start and complete the coursework while your spouse is on active duty.
