- Rosie Webb When in the semestrer would it best for us to hold Chrome River training for all faculty to attend? Answers: Never at the beginning of the semester. Maybe after the advising period, or perhaps in the middle of the semester. People are starting to travel again and this would be a way to refresh people's memories. Another suggestion would be to send a Qualtrics survey to the faculty to determine when these trainings would be best.
- University President Traveled to Dallas a few weeks ago to represent ASU with Stephen F. Austin about them joining the TTU System. After that meeting, traveled to Austin to meet with the legislature regarding funding. On November 7th, we will be naming the English Department after Ms. Natalie Ryan. We will also be celebrating the Best College to Work For! Award. Leadership Academy is coming up, and the Leadership Council has been put in place to help lead this initiative. - Provost We will have two graduation ceremonies on December 10th. The first is at 10:00am and the second at 2:00pm. We are looking at approximately 650 graduates this fall. Please watch the video sent out earlier this week about Anthology. We are not trying to make ASU an online institution. We are simply trying to expand our online program. They will be back on campus in October. Questions:
 Registration Why are transfer students the last to register? Many of them have quite a large number

of hours and some of the classes they need are closed by the time they can register. They should already be ranked by their level (Soph, JR. SR), so they should be able to register early. It may be because they are transfer students and are considered new students. Dual Credit – their credits sometimes don't transfer over until later in the fall semester, and therefore some students must register for courses they don't need. Not every school uses electronic transfers, which is the easiest way to get those credits into the system. We are also looking at students who are dropped for non-payment and then re-enrolled. This process is being reviewed as well. Some of this is in the Adminstrative Code. About 250 students are "hard dropped" and about 150 of them re-enroll.

You have associates evaluating full professors which shouldn't happen. This does not include T&P. People of a lower rank should not evaluate a higher ranked professor.
