I. Invited Guests

- A. General Hawkins, President Present
- B. Dr. Don Topliff, Provost and VP for Academic Affairs Present
- C. Dr. Clifton Jones, Vice Provost Present
- D. Ms. Jenny Love, Executive Director of Development & Alumni Relations Present

II. Announcements and Questions

- A. Executive Director of Development & Alumni Relations University
 - a. Launching a campaign in August for the university's centennial: Leading the Charge
 - i. Goal: raise \$128 million by 2028, raised \$67.2 million to date
 - ii. Kickoff event: August 22 (Rambunctious Week)

B. President

- a. Police have moved on campus but still encouraging use of ASU Safe App
- b. **SB 17**: we've made some changes (ex: shifted Dr. Madero's position and removed mention of equity from core values), still need to address the **CRASH program**

- c. <u>FAFSA</u>: issues with FAFSA have delayed enrollment for some students, but fall numbers should be fine (financial statements are currently being sent to students)
- d. <u>International faculty:</u> have reached out to David Morales to make sure they have the support they need, and things are moving in the right direction
- e. Another cohort of faculty can soon apply to the **Leadership Program** for the fall
- f. Artificial Intelligence: want to provide a certificate demonstrating familiarity with AI
- g. Graduation: there are athletics events at the same time so parking might be dicey
- h. Upper administration are working on legislative budget requests
 - i. Asking: artificial Intelligence and Cyber Security Center for Excellence
 - ii. Asking: program for student success
- i. Research and Innovation Hub: demolition on Concho Hall will begin soon
- j. <u>Air Force Sustainment Center</u> out of Tinker AFB visited recently: they want interns from ASU and want to create opportunities for research for students and faculty
- k. <u>Digital Learning</u>: working on sending out more information soon so you have full answers regarding the Distance Education Council, standardization, etc.
- I. Question: is faculty attendance at graduation required
 - i. Dr. Topliff: it's in the OP, so yes
- m. Question: regarding the Air Force internship, are they only interested in interns or also full-time? If they become full-time, are they active duty or civil servants?
 - i. President Hawkins: most of this is intended for civil service, but they're looking for all of the above
- n. Question: regarding the Artificial Intelligence and Cyber Security Center and the student success program, how much are you asking?
 - i. President Hawkins: \$7 million and \$2 3 million respectively
 - ii. Question: any there any other requests?
 - iii. President Hawkins: no, but those dollar figures could grow
- C. Provost and VP for Academic Affairs
 - a. Question: do **developmental plans** apply to tenured faculty?
 - b. Dr. Topliff: this OP only applies to Tenure Track, and post-tenure review serves as a de facto development plan for tenured faculty

IV. Standing Committee Reports:

- A. Academic Affairs
 - a. Met via email regarding 06.14 to discuss university Al policies
 - b. Declined unanimously to accept the administration's recommended policy on AI
- B. Bylaws and Standing Rules-Nothing to report
- C. University Affairs
 - a. Working to reconcile 06.28 (development plans) v. 06.19 (post-tenure review)
 - b. 06.29: only recommended change is that the committee the provost puts together should include at least one member of the Faculty Senate Executive Committee
 - c. This led to an extensive discussion about faculty development plans
- D. Committee on Committees
 - a. The survey is out (and open until May 1)

V. Unfinished Business

University Affairs: OPs 06.28; 06.29

- a. 06.28: back in committee
- b. 06.29: recommendation to add verbiage that Provost's Committee include a member of the Faculty Senate Executive Committee, will go back to committee

Academic Affairs: 06.14

- a. Recommendation from the committee: decline administration's proposed language
- b. This led to a discussion about what an AI policy should look like, how we should respond to administration's proposal, and what to consider as the committee report
- c. But, faculty unanimously disagree with the proposal to outright forbid use of AI detection tools
- d. This led to a discussion about whether to suspend the rules to allow a vote on the committee's recommendation
 - a. Motion to suspend the rules to vote today: Trey
 - b. Second: Andrew
 - c. Aye: 3, No: 17
- e. Motion fails
- f. Moving forward: Executive Committee will meet to discuss proper procedure for moving forward with the committee's recommendation

Fellowships, Grants, & Research (Ad-Hoc Committee)

- a. Innovation hub has taken over most of the charge of this committee
- b. Proposal that committee be dissolved, seconded by Brooke Dickison

Faculty Research/Creative Endeavors & Student Travel (Ad-Hoc Committee)

- a. Draft over student travel shows little that has changed in the policies
- b. President Hawkins has made it clear that more needs to be done

Library Committee (Ad-Hoc Committee)

- a. Renovations: going back to the drawing board
- b. Looking at opportunities for Friends of the Library to co-host events on campus
- c. They're looking at journals for culling, departments are encouraged to assist
- d. Doing a search platform change in the summer (after summer classes)
- e. Have made a position to an Instructional Designer to work with Dual Credit courses
- f. Are looking for a place to highlight faculty scholarship
