Types of Grants

Federal Business Grants

Federal government departments and agencies are among the biggest distributors of business grants. They are highly competitive and developing the application can be complex. The typical award range for federal grants is \$100,000 - \$1,000,000+. Visit [Grants.gov](https://www.grants.gov), a free and public database, to search for federal grant opportunities.

State Grants

Because federal grants can be particularly competitive — and limited in number — you might also seek out opportunities with state government departments and agency small-business grants. They are highly competitive and developing the application can be complex. The typical award range for state grants is \$100,000 - \$1,000,000+. Visit [Texas.gov](https://www.texas.gov), a free and public database, to search for state grant opportunities.

Local and Regional Grants

The Development Corporation Act of 1979 gives cities the ability to finance new and expanded business enterprises in their local communities through economic development corporations (EDCs). Chapters 501, 504, and 505 of the Local Government Code outline the characteristics of Type A and Type B EDCs, authorize cities to adopt a sales tax to fund the corporations, and define projects EDCs are allowed to undertake. Type A EDCs are typically created to fund industrial development projects such as business infrastructure, manufacturing, and research and development. Type B EDCs can fund all projects eligible for Type A, as well as parks, museums, sports facilities, and affordable housing. Contact your local Economic Development Corporation to learn more.

Corporate Grants

Many corporations and large companies have a philanthropic component that includes small-business grants. While some provide grants to nonprofits servicing specific industries only, some also give to for-profit companies.

Grants to Start a Business

If you're looking for startup business grants, you may have more difficulty finding available grants on any level. Some state and local governments, as well as private companies, however, may offer startup grants for small businesses.

Small Business Hardship Grants

Small-business hardship grants can help you recover after an emergency situation, like a natural disaster or public health crisis. Typically, these funds are available through the state or federal government.

Specialty Small Business Grants

To help spread entrepreneurial success across demographics, many organizations focus funding efforts on specific communities, such as rural and underserved areas.

How to Prepare for a Grant

Define the Funding

Business owners should outline the specific funding needed and identify the precise objectives a grant will help them achieve.

Create a detailed Business Plan

The next step is creating a business plan. Your plan should include essential details about your business, such as a company description, the business structure, services offered, financial projections, and other useful information.

Compile Administrative Information & Details

You should gather other vital details, such as the business owner's contact information, planned use for the grant money, the business' state tax identification number, the federal IRS employer identification number (EIN), and, if pursuing federal funding, the business' Unique Entity Identifier (UEI).

Gather Business Records

Business owners should also assemble all the necessary business records, which may include business formation documents and business financial statements from at least the last three years.

How to Make Your Grant Application/Proposal Stand Out

Understand Your Audience

First, understand what the organization is interested in supporting. When looking for funding opportunities for the population your organization serves, make sure that a foundation's goals align with the specific work your organization does. Research their mission statement and any other relevant information so you can craft an application and supporting documentation that speaks directly to them, and the goals of their grant.

Follow the Application Directions

Ensure all directions are followed carefully to eliminate confusion or delay in processing your request for funding. It's also essential to make sure all requested documents are submitted with the correct formatting, and within any specified time frame given by the granting body.

Proofread and Edit Thoroughly

Make sure there aren't any typos, grammar errors, or confusing sentences; run spell check; double-check facts; verify dates; look over figures; etc., so nothing slips through unnoticed prior to submission.

What to Avoid

Overapplying

When business owners apply for too many grants at one time, they decrease their chances of getting one due to reduced time and quality spent on each application. Instead, focus on applying for one or two grants that you're likely to receive.

Not following directions

Grant suppliers are looking to see if you meet a very specific set of criteria, so following directions is an absolute must. Do not provide more information than requested and ensure you've followed every instruction in the letter, including the submission deadline.

Watch out for Scams

Don't pay any money for a "free" government grant. If you have to pay money to claim a "free" government grant, it isn't a government grant and it isn't really free. A real government agency won't ask you to pay a processing fee for a grant that you have already been awarded—or to pay for a list of grant-making institutions. Make sure to do your research on the grant, especially if it comes from a corporation or large company.

Requirements after you Receive the Grant

Occasionally you may find a grant that comes with no strings attached, but this is uncommon. Once you receive a grant, you are accountable for following the guidelines set forth by the grant provider. For instance, most funders require you to provide progress reports so they can track the impacts of their funding over time.

The requirements for maintaining a grant are something you should be aware of ahead of time, although they are usually not too difficult to manage. Once you establish an agreement between the grant funder and yourself, you'll be set to move forward with your business or project.

Annual Small Business Grants

[FedEx Small Business Grant Contest](#): FedEx has an annual competition that awards \$290,000 to 10 small businesses, with the top prize being \$50,000 going to 3 companies and \$20,000 to 7 other companies. . Opens Jan 28- Feb 28 each year.

Women-owned Small Business Grants

<https://www.spanx.com/redbackpackfund>: The Red Backpack Fund. Each recipient received a gift of \$5,000, the exact amount Sara Blakely started Spanx with 20 years ago. So far, over 1080 female recipients have received funds

<https://ambergrantsforwomen.com>: Grants of \$10,000 each month are awarded to entrepreneurial women, along with two \$25,000 annual Amber Grants. Each month, one woman receives the \$10,000 and four others receive \$1,000. Each \$10,000 is eligible for one of two \$25,000 Amber Grant. There is also a Business Specific Grant in the amount of \$5,000 per month. The foundation announced several new grants this year, including a Marketing Grant and Business Category grant.

1. Go to www.grants.gov



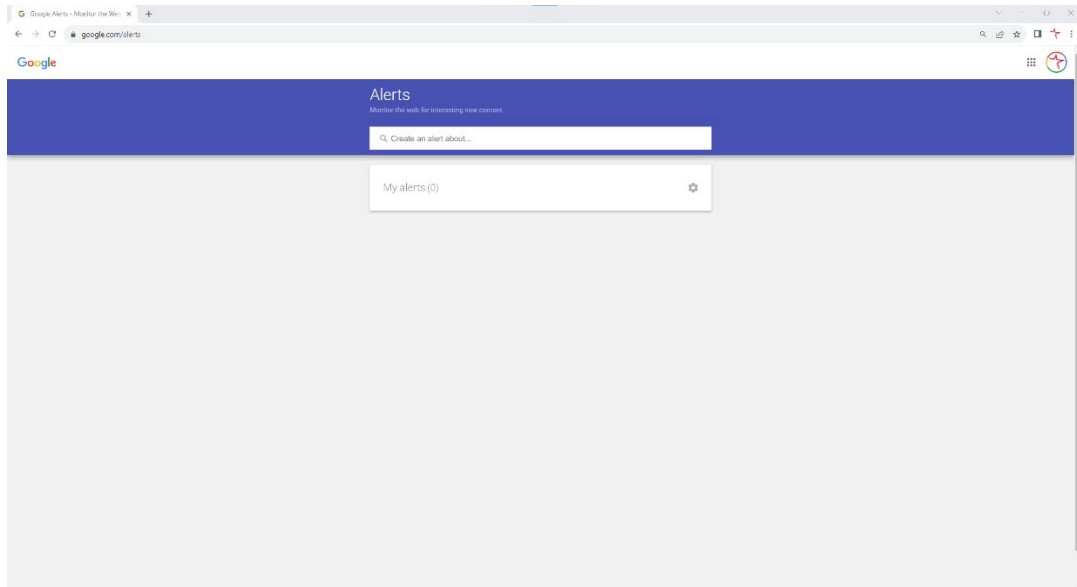

2. Navigate to the "Search Grants" Tabs at the top page
3. Under "Basic Search Criteria" Identify specifics to help you find a grant opportunity in your industry.

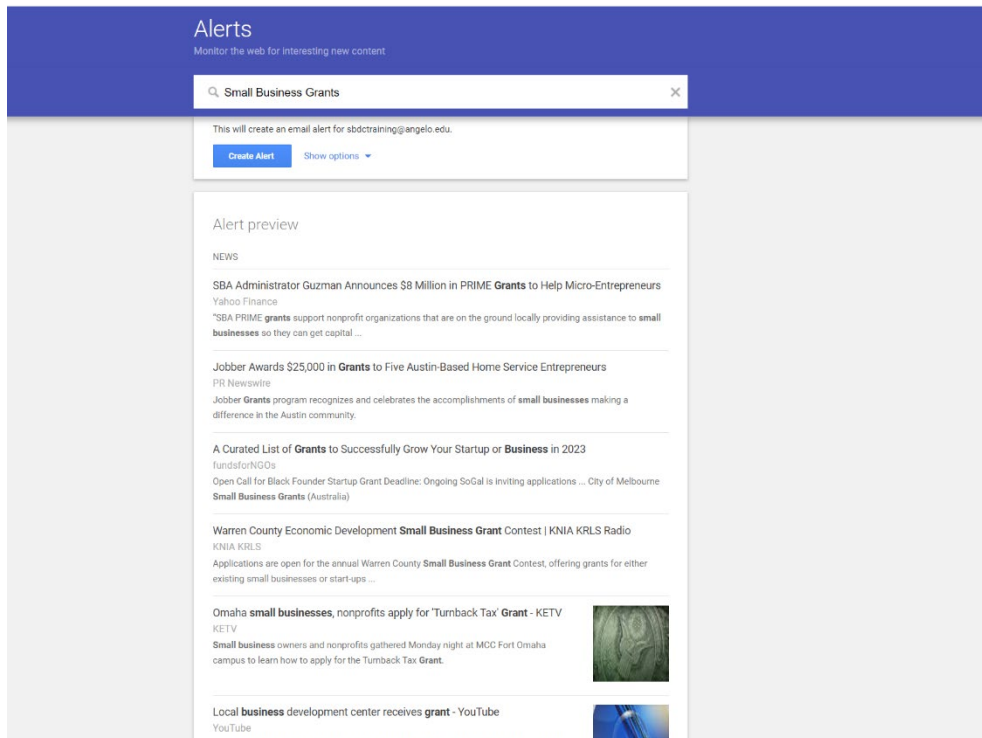
